## Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice

Washington State University offers individuals the opportunity to obtain bachelors' and graduate degrees, professional degrees, and certificates through distance technologies throughout Washington, nationally, and internationally.

The Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice is the interdisciplinary studies of institutions, policies, theories of human behavior, and philosophies of justice directly related to the maintenance of social order and the achievement of justice in society. Students take courses in political science, sociology and psychology as well as in criminal justice. The program is appropriate for those individuals pursuing careers in law enforcement, corrections, probation, and other social services.

### Program Prerequisites

The BA in Criminal Justice is a degree completion program designed primarily for students who have completed 27 semester (40 quarter) hours of transferable college credits with a grade point average of 2.0 or better. The program works especially well for individuals who have completed an Associate in Arts degree at Grays Harbor College.

In addition to the university-wide general education requirements (GERs), students must complete additional College of Liberal Arts requirements. At the time of admission, students' prior records will be assessed to determine their status in relation to satisfying these requirements.
