

GENERAL EDUCATION CREDIT GRANTED FOR AP EXAMS IN WASHINGTON – GRAYS HARBOR COLLEGE

Please refer to the tables following this page for complete information.

AP exam scores of three (3) or higher can be counted either for **Elective** or **General Education Credit** at most Washington public colleges and universities.

Elective Credit - Elective credit counts toward the total number of hours needed to earn a degree, but does not count toward general education or major requirements. All Washington public four-year colleges and universities grant at least elective credit for AP scores of 3 or above. **In the following tables, elective credit is designated as**

General Education Credit - Students seeking a degree from a four-year university in Washington must complete a specific number of general education credits in broad areas of knowledge, usually during their first two years. **The test score needed to earn general education credit is designated as follows in the table below.**

The Evergreen State College - An exception to the above is The Evergreen State College, which does not require a specific pattern of general education. **All AP scores of 3 or above are accepted by Evergreen for credit.**

Categories of General Education - AP exams are grouped by general education category: Written Communication (C); Quantitative Skills (Q); Humanities and Fine Arts (H); Social Sciences (SS); and Science (S).

Community College Tables Special Instructions - The scores needed for general education credit at the community and technical colleges are applicable to the category in which the exam is listed, except as follows:

- Some schools grant general education credit in more than one category for certain courses. **For example**, a score of 3 on the AP Exam for Calculus BC qualifies as general education credit in the areas of Quantitative Skills (Q) and Science (S) at Bellevue College. In the table this is designated as

3-Q/S

- Some institutions give general education credit for AP tests in **a different general education category** than the tests appear in. For example, at Clark College, an AP score of 3 on the AP English Language and Literature exam counts as general education credit in the Written Communication category (C), even though this exam is grouped in the Humanities and Fine Arts (H) category on the table. In the table this is designated as
