<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The focus of the institutional assessment plan during academic year 2021-2022 is increase faculty participation in establishing signature assignments that align with the course, program, and institutional outcomes. In addition, the focus is to establish a comprehensive, easy to use reporting process – the DSA Pre-Pilot Reporting Survey and DSA Pre-Pilot Reflection Survey. As a result, the data presented as Current is based on only Fall 2021 results from 33 faculty evaluating and reporting for the first time and the status represents Showing Progress in the overall plan. The DSA Pre-Pilot will continue through this academic year. The results will

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be used to inform improvements, but the focus is to establish a process, then 2022-2023 will more accurately establish a baseline.

<sup>ii</sup> Program student learning outcomes will be assessed through the programmatic assessment process. Academic year 2021-2022 focuses on programs, including general education, articulating program learning outcomes, analyzing program curriculum maps, and designing an assessment of student learning process and rotation.
