

## Naselle-Grays River Valley High School Running Start Equivalency Guide

Students should check with their high school counselor for the specific credits they need to graduate. Virtually all Naselle High School Students beginning as juniors will need to satisfy credits in English, US History, Contemporary World Problems (CWP), and Math and to a lesser degree Science, Occupational Education, Fine Art, and Health and Fitness. The number of credits required for each subject area will vary for each student. High school credit is granted at a rate of 5 college credits = 1 high school credit. With the exception of math, classes must be 100 level or above to receive Naselle High School credit.

| <b>PE</b>                               | 1          | Any PE or HPF 101 or Human Nutrition; least two<br>credits must be from physical education course  | 5              |
| <b>Elective</b>                         | 1          | Any 100 level or above credit  | 5              |
