- Students may choose to take the College Placement Test (CPT) to determine math placement.
- Students may choose to register for a course below the course they place into.
- Placement by this method expires twelve months after the student graduates from high school. The sooner a student takes his or her math class at GHC, the better success she or he is likely to have.
- Courses on the back of this page that include an ampersand (&) as part of their designation, such as MATH& 141, are included in WA Community and Technical College common course numbering.
- <u>STUDENTS</u>: Once your Math course begins, if you feel like it might be too difficult, please talk with your math teacher and/or your advisor or a counselor <u>as soon as possible</u> to see if you should change courses.
